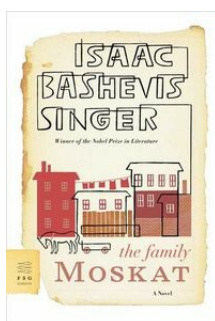


# THE FAMILY MOSKAT
